Countering EU's 'Borderism' A more-than-academic roundtable

For the 2023 Annual Meeting, the UNIOR Mobility and International Migration Studies Centre (MoMI) is aiming at gathering up group of scholars and practitioners to draft up a new agenda of intervention to move beyond what Henk van Houtum has recently defined as EU-driven 'discriminative borderism', i.e., the contemporary deadly and self-damaging nativistic border-politics allowing the authorities to stop, detain, and push-back people simply because they were born in the wrong country and are not wealthy enough to obtain a VISA in advance (van Houtum 2021).

In the case of the EU, about % of the world nationalities are blacklisted. Together with the brutal consequences in terms of criminalisation of migration and solidarity, border violence and deaths, this legalised-and-normalised apartheid has been making of the EU a large gated-community inhabited by 'dividuals' (Deleuze, 1992) in 'fear' (Bauman, 2006) and 'panic' (Cohen, 2002), while the outsourcing and externalisation of border control practices has turned migration into a profitable market for a variety of private actors (Infantino, 2017).

The discrimination and violent exceptionalization of a specific, significant part of global humanity is fed by decades of systemic disinformation and misrepresentations – a socio-cultural understanding of borders and migrations dynamics which has been shaped in accordance to a variety of economic and political features, and imbued with a mixture of racist, xenophobic, and aporophobic stances. In this sense, there is an urgent need to consider new ways of narrating, imagining, and representing global mobility, the struggle of people against discriminative enclosures, and to facilitate the emergence of a shared framework of intervention to counter this suicidal 'necropolitics' (Mbembe 2003, van Houtum and Bueno Lacy 2020).

With this aim in mind, we are organising two-days of collective discussion, brainstorming, and collaboration among academics, artworkers, activists, journalists, students, and interested citizens, to work together in a horizontal roundtable open to everyone.
